3. Report on the IASIL Conference, Queens University, Belfast

The unusually sunny weather in Dublin was general all over Ireland. After lumbering

my way from the train station to Queen’s University, the venue for the 2013 IASIL conference, a friendly intern ushered me into the Great Hall. Soon I spotted the Japanese delegates amid the luncheoning crowd, some slightly haggard from the long flight and jetlag, but no less delighted to meet colleagues from home and abroad.

Running from 22nd to 26th July, the Belfast conference showcased an impressive array of plenary lectures and parallel panels assembled under the general heading, ‘Urban Cultures’. This overwhelming diversity was mirrored by papers given by the Japanese delegates. The Japanese Joyceans - Professors Martin Connolly, Eishiro Ito, and Sachiyo Yamada - all read papers that reflected their original views. To this ensemble, Professors Yoko Sato and Kenichi Kihara and Dr. Chiaki Sameshima provided a nice Yeatsian counterbalance. The contemporary / North of Ireland perspective was supplied by Professor Masami Nakao, who read a paper on Seamus Heaney’s ‘The Tollund Man’. Other papers, which I regret missing due to clash in schedule, included Beckett, Sinéad Morrissey, and 19th century Irish fiction.

The intensity of the academic programme was matched by the excitement of social events, which commenced with a poetry reading that included the Belfast poet Ciarán Carson. This was followed on Wednesday by several bus tours around Belfast and a civic reception at the historic City Hall where mirth and drink was never lacking. Another reading was scheduled for Thursday for those who could not get enough of North of Ireland poets / writers. Friday came the grand finale, the perennially lavish IASIL conference dinner which my travel plans sadly prevented me from attending. Yet this was no real grievance for the week had already given me plenty of food for thought.
