





Access to Konan Women's University (Venue for 12 October)



Since school buses are NOT available on 12th October, **Konan-Yamate** is the most convenient station. You can reach Konan Women's University by 15-minute walk, taxi or local bus called the "Morikitamachi Donguri Bus".



To walk to Konan Women University from Konan-Yamate Station, take the route in the above map. It takes 15 minutes.

To reach KWU by local bus, take the bus heading for "Higasiyama Puraza Mae" (東山プラザ前) at the bus stop "Konan-Yamate Eki Mae" (just outside Konan-Yamate station) and get off at "Okamoto Terasuhause Mae" (岡本テラスハウス前). It takes 5 minutes. The bus leaves "Konan-Yamate Eki Mae" at: 7:50, 8:20, 8:50, 9:20, 9:50, 10:20, 10:50, 11:50, 12:20, 12:50, 13:20, 13:50, 14:50, 15:20, 15:50, 16:20, 16:50, 17:20, 17:50.



Access to Konan Gakuen Hirao Kinenkan (Venue for 13 October)

Konan Gakuen Hirao Kinenkan (甲南学園平生記念館) 29-15, 2 chome, Sumiyoshi-honmachi, Higashinada-ku, Kobe-shi 658-0051



Walking directions FROM nearby train stations

Hirao Kinenkan is about 700 meters northwest of **Sumiyoshi station** (**JR Kobe Line**) and 700 meters southeast of **Mikage station** (**Hankyu Kobe Line**), about a 10 to 15-min walk. From either station, the directions are relatively simple, but a bit hard to explain because the building is in a residential area with no prominent landmarks, shops or restaurants. Just follow the path through the residential area, trust your sense of direction, and you'll successfully get there!
