Items that can be included are books and articles (published in journals, collections of essays or conference papers, etc.) on individual Irish writers and on Irish literature and theatre more generally. Writing of a general cultural nature, e.g. on language, film, folklore, etc., can also be listed. We will also consider items on Irish-related works by English writers such as Spenser, Trollope, Thackeray and Arnold, and also book reviews, especially extensive ones which develop larger arguments (more than 2,500 words).
